And speaking of elections, Here are the election procedures for The ALLIANCE AMATEUR RADIO CLUB:

According to the by-laws of the A.A.R.C., election procedures are as follows:

An annual meeting for the election of officers is to be held in May, following the regular business meeting.

President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer are each elected by ballot for a term of one year. The new officers begin their duties in prepartion for the next (June) business meeting.

Any or all of the three trustees are to conduct the annual meeting. There is one out-going trustee each year who is replaced or reinstated by election also at the annual meeting.

The existing trustees serve as a nominating committee prior to elections. They will submit at least one name for each open office of someone who has acknowledged that he/she will accept the nomination. Nominations will be also be open to the floor.

Any full, sustaining or family member is eligible to run for or hold office.

In order to vote, run for or hold office at the annual meeting, 1988-1989 dues must be paid prior to elections. This can be done before, during or after the regular business meeting May 2, 1988.

Special thanks to Patti KE8KH for putting this procedure together from the by-laws.
