Chemical Fire!!

As most of you are aware, the "roadway" terminal burned, on May 31,1988. This building also housed Clem Properties. In addition, several other businesses (including D-CON), rented warehouse space in those buildings. When burning, the chemicals produced a cloud, which was potentially harmful. The residents within 1-5 miles around the fire, were evacuated to Stanton Middle School, in Alliance. portion of the businesses in town closed for the day, due to the smoke cloud which hung over the town. By mid-afternoon, people were beginning to return to their homes, as the all clear was sounded. The safety forces, and (especially!) the Red Cross, are to be commended for the handling of this emergencies.

No, the hams were not called out. The local repeaters were manned and ready, should a callout be necessary. Additionally the Police, and Red Cross were aware of this. As it turned out, communications worked well due in part, to the communications van brought in the county Emergency operations center, and we were not called out.

Some good has come out of this, though. In talking to the city safety service director, it was learned that the city has created a special post, to handle the emergency preparedness plans, and we plan to meet with him soon, to ensure that the amateur community has a place in those plans. More to come.
