FIELD DAY '91'

Well, Field Day '91' is just a fond memory for most of us (and a nightmare for some-HEE HEE). The AARC set up camp behind Marlinton Middle school again this year, where we had acres of room, plenty of shelter for the food, and eyeball QSO's, and of course, from the rain. (Rain is a requirement for all field days). Setup began promptly at 8 AM, and progressed pretty smoothly this year. We quickly erected the clubs newly sandblasted & painted towers, along with a variety of wire antennas, and a couple of trap verticals. A tri-band beam was also erected, to which the nickname P.O.S. #1 was found to be especially descriptive. We ran five stations this year, and used WI8T for four of them, and KB8LJN/N for the Novice/Tech station.

The highlight of Saturday was the low altitude fly-by of a Navy F-14 with wings extended. The covered dish dinner was great. The turnout was a little low due to the weather, but that meant more than enough food was left over to tide the operators over until the end of field day.

We made 657 QSO's this year (302 CW/355 SSB) for a total score (before bonuses) of 1918 pts. We worked 65 sections, 45 states, and 3 DXCC countries. The best band this year was 40 meters with 35% of the total CW QSO's, & 20% of the SSB QSO's being made there. We were short on operators in the wee hours of the morning, but some people just don't know what they're missing.

Dan(N8LVO), did a super job again as publicity chairman for the event. We got a real nice article in the Canton Repository, about a week before the event, followed by a visit to the site by a photographer, which resulted in a real nice 10" X 7" color picture a few days later of KC3CL, & his son, KB8LJN.

In closing, a big thank you to everyone who pulled together to make this event fly. (de WX8G)
