## Elections see some new faces



## The Case of the Leaky TV

I am an electronics technician by trade and I am used to fixing things and having them stay fixed.

That is why a case this summer was so frustrating that I was beginning to think someone was trying to pull a fast one on me.

I was called out to service a 3-year-old Sylvania TV. Upon arrival, I found a horizontal blanking problem which required shop repair. I removed the chassis and brought it to the shop. On the bench, I found and replaced three resistors in the sandcastle pulse circuit. I then test-ran the chassis for 2 hours before returning the chassis to the customer.

The next morning, the customer called, saying that the set had stopped working. So, back to the customer's house I went.

When I walked into the room, the first thing I saw was a puddle of water on top of the TV. I could find no rea-

son for it because the only thing on top of the TV, besides some knick-knacks, were the antenna rotor box and the VCR. The insides of both of these were bone-dry, the ceiling was dry and there were no air conditioning vents nearby. However, the inside of the TV was wet!

I cleaned the chassis and replaced the resistors (again!) and test-ran the chassis for 2 days before returning it. The next day (You guessed it!) the set died again. The puddle of water was not present this time, but I had my suspicions.

I took the set to the shop again, cleaned the board, replaced the resistors, then test-ran the set for 2 weeks. I then returned the set on Thursday at 1 p.m.

On Friday, the customer called again. The picture was coming and going. When I walked into the house, this time the puddle was back.

It was time to test my suspicions. I pulled out my knife and sliced into the rotor cable. It was wet! I went out to the tower and did the same. Water started seeping out around my knife blade. I knew I had my answer.

I went to the basement with the customer and cut two slits in the cable to let it drip (and drip it did!). Problem solved! Unfortunately, it was too late for the set as the residue from the water had adhered itself to the circuit board and defied all attempts at cleaning or repair. It was also too late for the tuner module in the VCR after we set the rotor box on top of it.

The rotor cable was 4 wires covered by a grey jacket and obviously made a good water pipe. The water was getting into the cable at the top of the 30 foot tower. A good reason why we should all seal our coax and cables.
