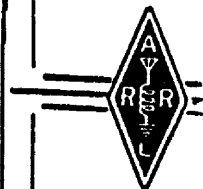

Novice Classes are in full swing. The ten students are doing great and each will be an added asset to Amateur Radio.

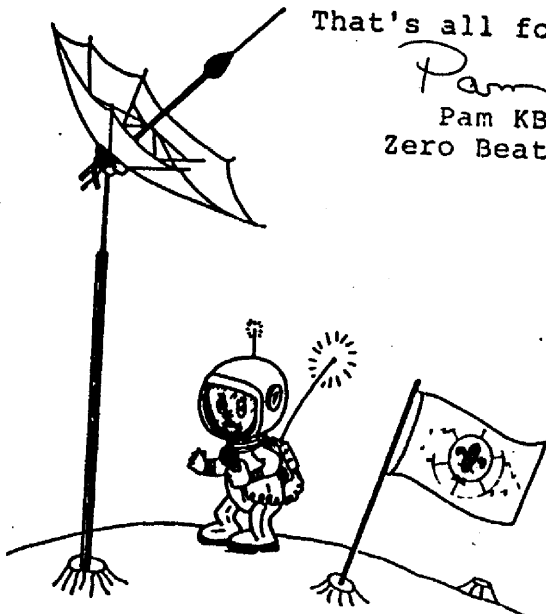
