From the ARRL Letter;

The ARRL/VEC has received notification that the FCC had voided the upgrades of 23 amateurs in the New York City area. The session in question was held in January 86, and has been under investigation by both the FCC and the ARRL/VEC for irregularities. The VE team Liaison was discredited in November of 1986 for irregularities detected in several sessions that year. (Liaisons are responsible for test material security while in the possession of the VE team) Each individual's license class (if any) reverts to the class that he or she held prior to the test. The individuals ARE still eligible to apply for upgrades. The action came as a surprise, as there had been no communication concerning this investigation from the FCC in nearly 18 months. (May 13, 1988)

CALLSIGNS - 270 new calls were issued during the month of April, in the 8'th call area. Latest word is that turnaround time for new licenses, and renewals at the FCC has speeded up considerably. This is good news for everyone. Congratulations to a couple of new upgrades recently. Allen Dicks KA8CIY general to advanced; Pam Myers, N8IAK, Tech to General; Bobby Virant, KB8AVM, Novice to Tech; & Ann Virant, KB8BYM, Novice to Tech. Congratulations everyone!

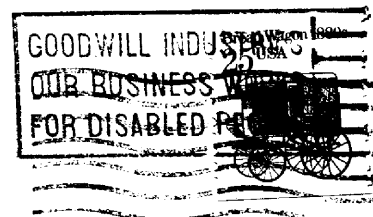
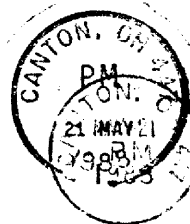
