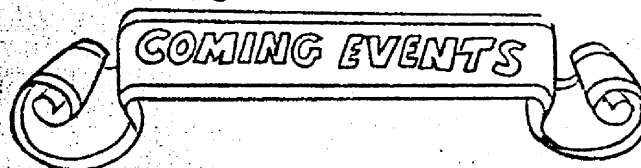
He is also taking along some six meter sideband equipment, and plans to be the first operator to operate six meter sideband from Guantanamo Bay. So mark your calendars, and good DX.
