get the idea we've been doing it a long time and that we're experts."

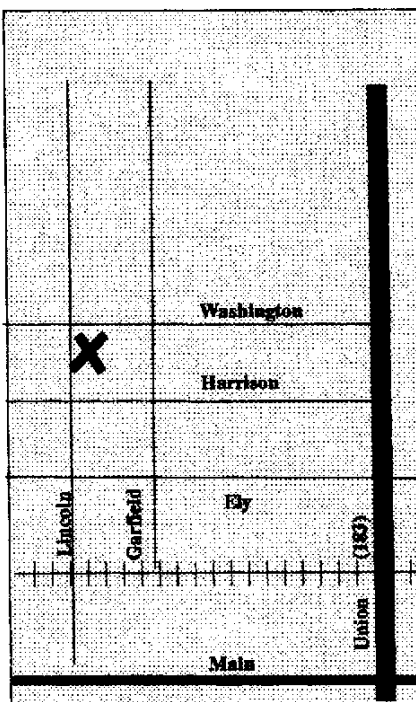

LOSES LICENSE

Jorge Mestre, NS3K, of Fairfax Va., has pled guilty to communicating a false distress signal on Aug. 7, 1992. Mestre will surrender his FCC Amateur Radio license, dispose of his radio equipment, and make immediate restitution to the Coast Guard of \$50,000. Sentencing is set for May 7.

SOFTWARE PIRATES NABBED

Employees of IBM, Philips, the

German federal interior ministry and the federal office for the protection of the constitution are among those who unwittingly 'turned themselves in' when a German computer software company resorted to an undercover strategy to find out who was using illegal copies of one of its programs.

Hundreds of customers accepted Cadsoft's offer of a free demonstration program that, unknown to them, searched their computer hard disks for illegal copies.

Where the search was successful, a message appeared on the monitor screen inviting the customer to print out and return a voucher for a free handbook of the latest version of the program. However, instead of a handbook the users received a letter from the Bavarian-based software company's lawyers. Since last June about 400 people have returned the voucher.

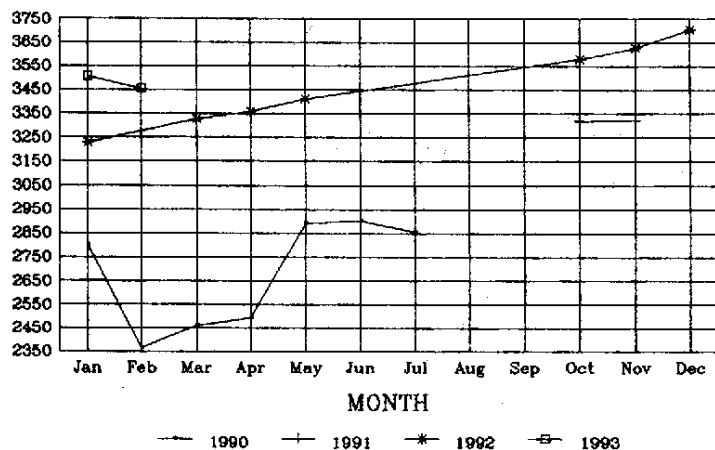

Clubs Take Amateur Radio to the People

The Alliance (Ohio) ARC organized a successful mall show exhibit September 13-15, 1992, with several other area clubs. The Carnation Mall in Alliance was the site for this multiclub effort to show the public what Amateur Radio is all about. According to 1992 Mall Show Committee Chairman John Myers, WX8G, this was the sixth year for the event. Members of the Alliance Youth ARC, the Salem Area ARA and the Canton ARC helped set up displays and operated the exhibit's Amateur Radio station.

Preparation for the event began two weeks beforehand with an antenna-raising party on the mall roof. Myers described the ingredients for the party: "The roof crew installed 1350 feet of RG-8 (that's a quarter mile!), 16 barrel connectors, three HF verticals, three J-poles and two magnetic-mount antennas."

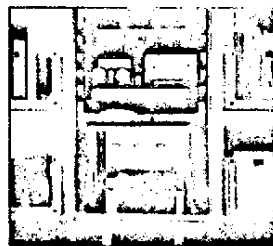
The Amateur Radio station saw lots of on-the-air action over the weekend, with contacts on packet, AMTOR, SSB, CW and FM. Meeting with the public was the primary goal and Don Whitaker, KR0MO,

presented a talk on Saturday. "Don has been active in the ARES and SKYWARN programs for many years," said Myers. "His experience showed, as his speech was very well received."

The award for the best display of the show went to Jim Wilson, KB8GHZ, and Gladys Wilson, KB8GIA, who designed and built a prototype of a portable emergency communications station.—thanks to John Myers, WX8G, and The Zero Beat, Alliance ARC newsletter.

It includes HF and VHF/UHF equipment, simple antennas, batteries, tools, ropes, power supply, light and message forms. The whole station is in a self-contained cart that may be closed, locked and rolled out of the way when not in use.

Teen will not face federal charges in hoax

Sources say a 19 year old will not face federal charges after falsely reporting a plane crash via 2 meters on the evening of January 25.

On the evening of January 25 and the early morning hours of January 26, Western New York hams monitored and responded to distress calls originating on a frequency of 146.220 MHz. The individual reported that he was involved in a light plane crash in northern Niagara county. Transmissions continued for nearly 4 hours.

Local amateurs worked closely with local police, fire and other agencies in an attempt to locate the downed aircraft. Emergency personnel searched the rural area for 2 days and after discovering nothing, declared it a hoax.

The next day, the Niagara County Sheriff Dept. was told by a local electronics store, that an individual had purchased a handheld amateur transceiver the day of the hoax and had returned it to the store the next day. After amateurs had supplied authorities with a tape of the event and direction finding data gathered on that evening, a local 19 year old pleaded guilty to third degree false reporting of an incident. He could face 90 days in jail and a \$500 fine. He is not a Ham.

Under federal charges he could have faced a \$10,000 fine and a year in jail. Estimated cost to the county for the search is in excess of \$60,000.

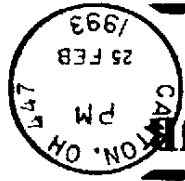
