

Some common sense operating tips

In our enthusiasm for our hobby, it is common, while on the air, to rattle on with a ham friend about every day things.

However, it is easy to forget that there are countless people listening on scanners, short wave radios, and, unfortunately, some stolen rigs. In that light, consider some of the following on your next transmission:

DO NOT use the last names of your contacts. All that is necessary are their calls and first names. Why? Hams in this area have been contacted by total strangers who have picked up their identity, their residential location and a lot more about them than they care for strangers to know. Mail and phone calls have been received and some have even been visited by their unknown listeners without an invitation.

ZERO BEAT: The art of all parties being on the same frequency.

So far, nothing derogatory has come of any of it, but consider the potential.

DO NOT give phone numbers, repeater codes or repeater functions over the air. The touch tone kerchunkers will try whatever they hear you tell someone! Tell a person requesting info you will bring up the patch for them and suggest you make contact by phone for passing any additional info.

DO NOT inform all listeners that a person being called is out of town or on vacation. I recently heard during a net, when a ham was called and no response -- "Oh, ol' Joe Brown W8XYZ is is Florida and won't be home for two weeks yet." Any larcenous crackpot listening now knows he has two weeks to burglarize the place. The same goes for persons temporarily in the hospital. Don't belabor the point on the air. Use the twisted pair. Many spouses are left alone and are not home for many hours while visiting.

DO NOT attempt to take issue with someone who is obviously creating malicious interference. Make every effort to determine from where the signal is coming, but ignore the activity. These people thrive on the argument they get from others. If you can't beat 'em, don't join 'em ... IGNORE 'em! Without confrontation, the antagonist will usually go away.

DO be willing to lend a hand to a new ham. Be helpful, not critical about an occasional mistake or an improper procedure. Consider being an "Elmer." DO respond to a ham who is "listening on frequency." Quite often, it is an out-of-towner who is seeking information, needs directions or is just plain bored of sitting in a motel room somewhere and wants to chat.

One of the most common complaints of hams who are traveling is the lack of response from local hams. The travelers do not feel welcome. Put yourself in their position.

Consider how nice it would be to have a "Ham Fraternity" brother or sister respond to your inquiry in a strange location or situation.

DO make every effort to be available for Public Service activities which request Amateur Radio for their communications. Not only does Amateur Radio get a positive reaction from the public, most of the activities are rewarding and allow us to use our skills and equipment for the benefit of ourselves and others.

Amateur Radio can only be what you make it. It can be an enjoyment or a hassle. It can be discouraging or very rewarding.

Plain old common sense and consideration of others, in most of our daily activities will keep us on a positive plane and out of trouble.





NEW GUIDELINES

The FCC has proposed changing its guidelines for evaluating environmental RF radiation, to reflect the guidelines adopted in 1992 by the American National Standards Institute and the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers, Inc.

The new guidelines differ significantly from those they replace, the commission said. For example two tiers of exposure levels are now recommended, one for controlled environments, and another, generally more restrictive, for uncontrolled environments. Also, new restrictions are

placed on currents induced in the human body by RF fields below 100 MHz.

Another significant change is the imposition of stricter limitations on automatic exclusions for low-power devices, such as hand-held radios and telephones, based on operating power. The 1982 guidelines generally excluded such devices with powers of seven watts or less. The new guidelines contain more complex and more restrictive criteria for such exclusions, with allowable power decreasing as frequency increases.


John WX8G and Pam N8IAK were the only close ones. "If we had 5 more minutes we would nabbed 'em," said Pam.



A HAM NEEDS HELP

Three years ago, Dave and Sharon Brower WA4NST and N4XLF were shopping for a new home and found one in Suburban Acres in Vero Beach.

Dave, who is an avid CW DXer and his wife, Sharon, a SSB DXer, were certainly aware that some neighborhoods fabricate ridiculous deed restrictions designed to prohibit various and sundry antennas.

With that in mind, Dave was careful to ensure that his new house would be free of deed restrictions and have a good location for their amateur radio station.

"We found a good deal on a nice home in Suburban Acres. We studied the papers and it didn't appear that there were any deed restrictions," Brower said.

For more than two months Dave and Sharon opearated on all bands using a vertical antenna. They never received a single complaint.

It was not until the Browers erected their DXer's dream tower, a 68 foot Rohn, with a Telrex 5-element 20 meter monobander, etc. that things heated up. Suddenly there were problems with anything and everything.

Dave immediately addressed an interference complaint and had his station certified First Class by a telecommunications technician. Dave then approached his neighbor and said he would work with him, only to be told, "That's fine, but I want that tower taken down."

Only days after the tower went up, the telephone threats started. The tower was going to be "dynamited," the caller said.

Dave then tried to reason with his neighbor. What was the problem?

"I don't like the way it looks and it's got to come down," said his friendly neighbor. The neighbor then enlisted the support of other neighbors who agreed the tower was a violation of the deed restrictions for Suburban Acres. Eventually seven households filed suit in the 19th Judicial Circuit and the Browers were served a summons in December 1990.

The case was presented before Circuit Judge Charles E. Smith of the 19th Judicial Circuit of Indian River County, FL. According to Brower, his attorneys, led by Clifford Miller, made a brilliant presentation.

However Judge Smith was not impressed. He ruled Brower's transmissions were a "noxious and offensive activity" and the appearance of the tower and antenna is an "annoyance and nuisance" to the neighborhood.

Judge Smith also ruled that the tower is a "building" that exceeds the two-story limitation ... The deed restrictions are silent about antenna support structures.

Sharon and Dave are both college graduates and have highly respectable positions in society. With a marked sense of sarcasm, Dave said, "It was like they were here first so we can't play in the sandbox."

Asked if he might move to solve the problem, Dave said, "I am more concerned about this issue and its impact on ham radio. I have spent thousands on this so far but I can't back off now. Yeah, it's easy to say



I'll move but I'm right legally. This is a federal issue now. I have to blow \$10,000 on the appeal and I don't have a choice. I could move, but I'm right as a ham. If I don't appeal this, we are all screwed."

Today, the Browers are barred from any transmissions from their home or they will be held in contempt of court. Pending appeal, the judge has stayed his order to remove the tower and antenna.
