

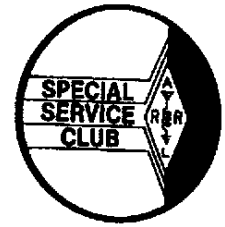

Columbiana Co. picnic to draw at least 5 clubs

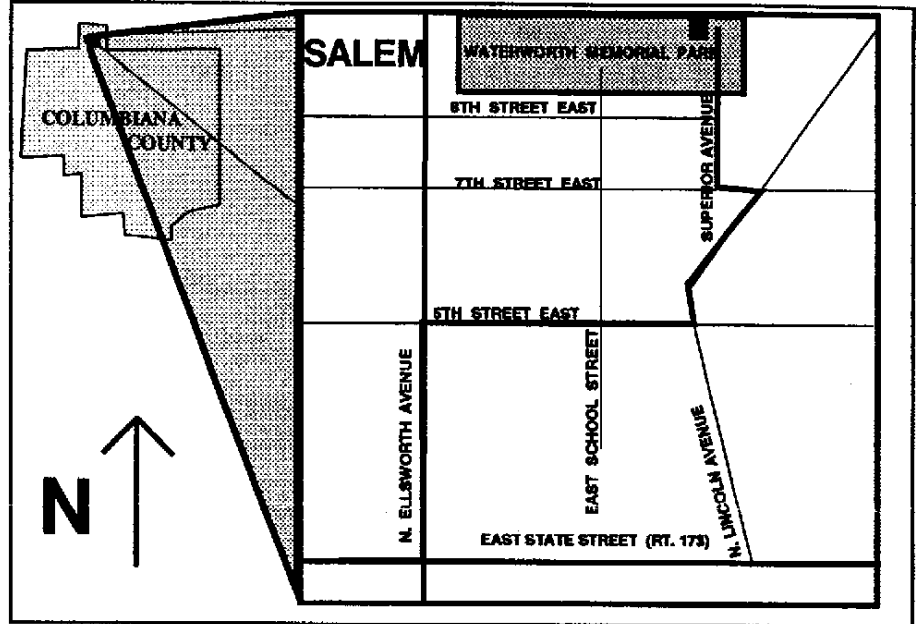
The Columbiana County Area Ham Radio clubs picnic will feature at least 5 clubs this year.

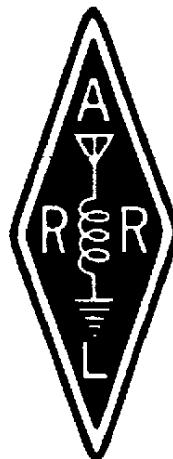

ICOM 28H PROBLEM

If you operate an Icom IC-28A or 28H model 2-meter rig you may be at risk of burning out the final power module with prolonged transmissions.

Check your rig periodically to see if the top cover, at the back near the heat sink, is getting excessively hot. If the heat sink seems cool, by comparison, then the power module is at risk of burning out with extended transmitting.

The problem is that heat from the module is not being adequately transferred to the heat sink fins to allow for heat dissipation into the air.

The fix? Add silicone heat transfer paste to the module on the back of the unit and say, Hasta Lavista, Baby!

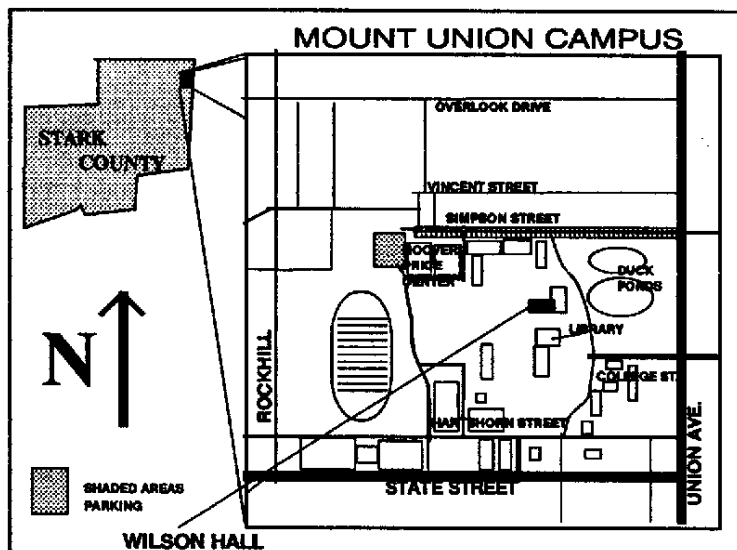

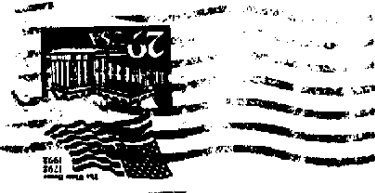
