

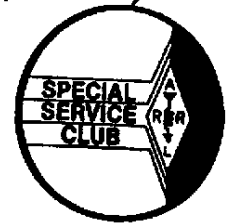

ZERO BEAT: The art of all parties being on the same frequency.

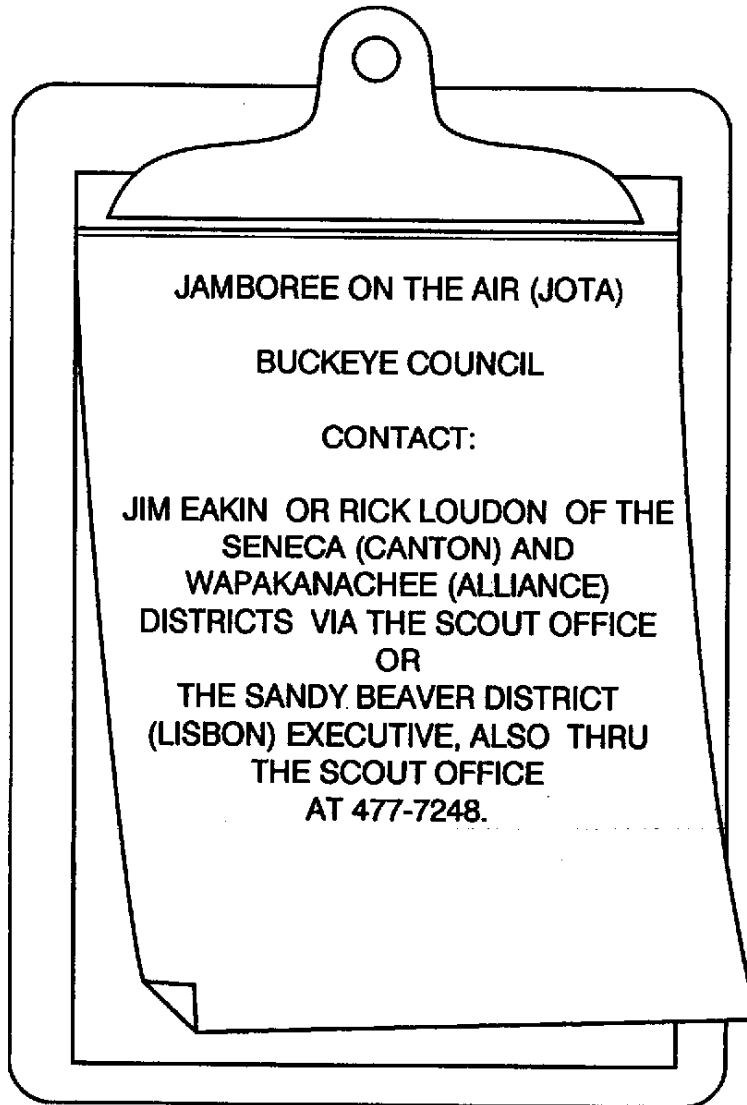

THE DAWN OF A NEW AGE?

So deed restrictions are keeping you from putting up an adequate antenna system? Or maybe your lease states, "No outside antennas allowed!" Don't get mad - get cable-ready HAM radio!

Cable-ready HAM radio is the newest step in cable TV. Available only to persons with amateur radio licenses, cable-ready HAM radio makes use of state-of-the-art fiber optics about the size of a yak hair!

Here are some of the features:

*You can work any station, any mode, with just 1.5 watts out to anywhere in the world!

*All received signals are guaranteed S9 plus 20!

Thanks to the Communications Act of 1993 that went into effect Sept. 13, cable TV stations must allow you access to their transmission wires. The result? Three new services which are changing the face of the amateur radio.

How about an exclusive HAM radio Shopping Network? It's coming in 1994. How about a continental ATV network operating 24 hours each day? Plans are already underway for a world-wide hookup in 1995. But what's available right now?

Cable-HAM radio.

There are three tiers of service. Basic cable-ready HAM (CAB-HAM

-A) radio gives you contact with any other basic cable-ready HAM radio station within 50 miles of your station location. Extended-basic HAM radio (CAB-HAM-B) gives you access to any cable-ready HAM radio station within the continental United States and Canada. Premium HAM radio (CAB-HAM-C) gives you total world access.

A unique feature of CAB-HAM-C,



is that you are also given access to Pay-Per-Country (PPC) mode. PPC allows you to schedule your DX operating time more efficiently. Once your license class has been verified from FCC files, you will be able to check the PPC schedule (included in your monthly bill) and choose the countries you'd like to work. (Note: most of the rare countries are currently only available to Extra class operators in the CW band) The system works much like the cable TV that persons receive from satellite dishes. Subscribers like

5H1CJ in far off Tanzania, send a standard CQ on 3.510 MHz. This is one of the local link frequencies monitored by PPC radio in Africa. 5H1CJ's signal is retransmitted up to an orbiting amateur radio satellite, which beams the signal back to all stations on the PPC network.

The system is full duplex and is capable of 2 million simultaneous QSOs per hour.

PPC subscribers are guaranteed to be on the air at least 4 times per month. A special adapter plugs from the cable line directly into your transceiver. Have your radio turned on at the specified time, and after hearing the station, press the authorization button on your remote control (included in the package). You are automatically logged with the station and your QSL card will be included in your next bill. (Note: failing to pay your PPC bill on time will result in all future QSL cards stamped, "Sorry, not in log.")

Basic rate is \$3 per month. Extended is \$7 and Premium is \$10, PLUS there is a \$1 per country charge per QSO. For more information, check the your nearest packet network for word on this new age of radio!

Moved and Seconded: the Sept. 2 meeting

All officers and trustees were present except for Larry Ashburn KE8VE, Allen Dicks WI8T and John Bray KF8ZG.

The meeting was called to order at 7:32 p.m. by President Pam Myers N8IAK with 18 members and 1 guest. Guest for the evening was Mike Goshorn N8KNU.

John Myers WX8G gave the treasurer's report for Allen WI8T. John reported a total balance of \$3,629.58. This is a net decrease of \$212.29 for the month. Breakdown: \$467.37 in checking; \$622.11 in savings; \$2,528.83 in CDs; \$11.27 in petty cash.

Expenses for July and August were \$258.47. Breakdown: \$6.79 for refreshments; \$22.05 for membership cards; \$25 for key show room; \$35 for post office box; \$58.77 for newsletter; \$58.30 for Job Time Jon; \$52.56 for Field Day food.

Income for July and August was \$46.18. Breakdown: \$13 for 50/50; \$5.65 for refreshments; \$7.53 for refund of Field Day overpayment.

ELECTION RULES & REQUIREMENTS

Article I.

Meetings of membership

A. The annual meeting of this club shall be held in the month of October, for election of officers and trustees immediately following the regular meeting in October.

C. The affairs of the AARC shall be managed by a Board of Directors: consisting of seven members elected in accordance with Articles II and VIII of the Bylaws.

D. Robert's rules of order shall govern all proceedings.

Article II.

Officers

A. The officers of this club shall number four (4). They are to consist of a President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer.

B. The officers shall be elected for a term of one year by ballot of members present at the annual meeting. New officers will take over their duties at the next regular meeting.

Article III.

Duties of officers

A. The President shall preside at all meetings of this club and conduct them according to Robert's Rules of Order. The President shall be responsible to ensure positions are filled to conduct business of the club. Examples of these positions are: Newsletter Editor, Equipment Chairman, Program Chairman, etc.

B. The Vice-President shall assume all duties of the president in his/her absence. He/she shall also organize club activities and programs not otherwise designated to a committee, or other member.

C. (1) The Secretary shall record minutes of all meetings, keep a roll of members and receive applications for membership.

(2) The Treasurer shall receive and receipt all monies paid to the club, keep an accurate account of all monies received and expended, pay no bills without a majority vote at a regular meeting by the club, and shall make a brief financial report at each regular meeting.

All officers shall, within ten (10) days after the expiration of their terms, turn over to their successors all records and property of the club, that is in their possession, that is pertinent to the office vacated.

C. Membership Classes and Dues:

1. SUSTAINING MEMBERSHIP - Any licensed Radio Amateur, contributing \$15.00 or more annually to the Alliance Amateur Radio Club, Inc. will be placed on the Sustaining Membership Honor Roll, for their generous contribution to the club treasury. The Sustaining member has full club privileges which include voting rights, the newsletter and holding office.

2. FULL MEMBERSHIP - Any licensed Amateur Radio Operator, contributing \$10.00 annual dues, is entitled to all privileges as above except Honor Roll status.

Article VIII.

Trustees

A. There shall be three (3) elected trustees, to be decided on by a vote of the membership.

B. Trustees terms will be for three years. One trustee is to be elected annually to replace the out-going trustee.

C. The trustees shall have the control and management of the property of the club, subject only to the action of the membership, audit the books of the corporation, conduct the annual meeting, and further duties as may be required of them by the members.

D. The election of the trustees shall be held at the annual meeting.

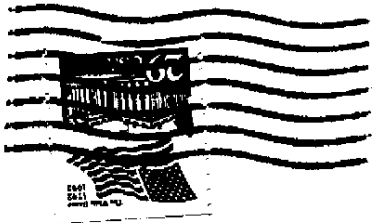
