October 3, 2001

Attention was called to the Ohio Bi-centennial in 2003, the Ohio QSO party, and Carnation Days in the Park for possible special events and club exposure. John KD8MQ will look into procedures for a special call sign.

John KD8MQ moved that a donation of \$25 be sent to QSL.Net for our web site and e-mail. The motion was seconded by Bob K8RLS, and approved.

The Ham of the Year votes are to be sent to Jerry KG8RN by November 30.

Dean KA8GRC moved that an additional Silent Key plaque be obtained. The motion was seconded by John KD8MQ, and approved.

Medina Hamfest tickets were distributed.

The 50-50 drawing was won by Don K8OMO.

The meeting adjourned at 8:25 P. M., upon motion by David N8NLZ, seconded by Larry KE8VE.

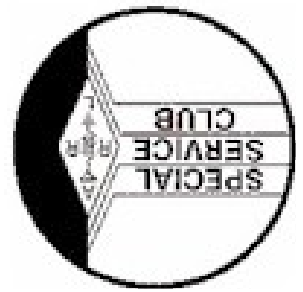
