During this test local communities will test their warning sirens and Cable TV operators as well as local radio stations will also test their early warning announcements. The test will take place at 9:50 AM.

activate a Skywarn Net on the 147.12 Repeater for the purpose of taking check-ins from local stations. Station location as well as verification of any sirens heard will be collected and forwarded to both Cleveland NWS and the Stark County EMA Office.
