AARC takes 98th out of 303 in class!

The 2008 Field Day results have been released. W8LKY, operating in class 3A placed 98th out of 303 other class 3A stations this year. According to the ARRL website, we posted an official score of 3,340 (533 phone / 381 CW).

This is in contrast to our 2007 score of 3800, and 2006 score of 4810. Our scores seem to be decreasing, but the comment most heard from

folks this year was how much fun they had.

Remember, Field Day 2009 is only 7 months away.

For comparison, here's results for some local clubs:

Canton ARC: 4,190 points running 2A, reporting 31 participants.

Massillon ARC: 4,530 points running 2A, reporting 25 participants

Portage County ARS: 5,944 points running 4A,

KD8MQ Rotor is Kaput!

For probably 20 years, I've had a 25ft tilt-over mast mounted behind my garage. It was mounted to a large CDR (I think) rotator. The rotator mounted to a flange that was welded to a steel plate buried 12" down.

I recall that Matt, N8EAD got me the plat from his worksite. It took 6 guys to carry it to my back yard.

On top of the mast was a tri-bander that I had cobbled together from a TA-33, and a TA-33 Junior. It's sat,

unused, for the last 15 years. About 10 years back, half of the driven element fell off in a storm.

I figured that the time had come to remove what was left of the tri-bander, so I used a block & tackle to lower the mast assembly. With the help of Mr. Saws-all, the U-bolts holding the antenna to the mast were cut away. When I began to raise the mast back into position, I notice the rotator had cracked. I'm unsure what caused it, but I suspect I should have dug a short trench for the body of the

rotor to lay into as it was lowered.

I installed a pulley so I could raise my 80/40 Meter dipole to the top of the mast. So, we are partially back on the air, at least until moving day.

December, 1988, (editor N8IAK)

- At this time in our history, The club was meeting on the first Monday of the month, in hospitals 2nd floor conference room.
- This months spotlihter was on Allen Dicks, WI8T.
- The results were in for the 1988 June VHF QSO Party. Club president, Dave, KC3CL had clinched first place in his state, & division.
- In answer to questions that had been raised as to the format, and content of the newsletter, a newsletter survey form was included in that months issue.
- The club was holding a DXCC contest for AARC members only, which was to begin on Jan 1, 1989. The prize was to be a handsome plaque, and a \$150 Ham Radio

gift certificate.

- The AARC Christmas party was coming up. It was being held at Coletta's. The most expensive entrée on the menu was a 8 oz. strip steak for \$9.60, and that included a 20% gratuity! In case you're wondering, Coletta's was at the corner of State & Cherry, where Walgreens stands today.
- The ARRL Ten Meter contest was coming up. The club was operating the contest from the home of Allen, WI8T, on S. Arch Ave.
- The Salem club was holding a pancake breakfast at St. Paul's school to raise funds for a communications trailer.

December, 1993 (editor KD8MQ)

- After a sudden change in editors, John, KD8MQ moved into the editors chair, after volunteering to be "temporary" editor.
- The 1993 mall show was history. This years show included displays from SAARA,
