October Meeting Minutes

October 7, 2009

The regular meeting of the Alliance Amateur Radio Club was held on October 7, 2009 at 7:30 PM at Alliance Community Hospital with club President Frank Sanor, WA8WHP presiding. The pledge of allegiance was recited followed by introductions. There were 13 members present along with Miriam Sanor and guest Benjamin Davis, KD8KMQ.

For the Secretary's report Don, AB8KV thanked Vice President John, KD8MQ for handling last month's meeting minutes due to his absence. He then thanked the club for the get-well card signed and sent to Don's wife Judy in the aftermath of her cancer surgery. The Secretary's report was approved on a motion from Tom, KD8JRK and seconded by George, K3GP.

Treasurer Mary Ann, KB8IVS then gave the Treasurer's report. Don, K8OMO had a question concerning what the club bylaws actually stated about how much money could be held in petty cash versus being deposited. After some brief discussion, President Frank asked Secretary Don to check his copy of the bylaws and report at the next meeting. The Treasurer's report was then approved on a motion by Don, K8OMO and seconded by Tom, KD8JRK.

Old business:

November 2009

•President Frank commented about how enjoyable the club picnic had been. Several others added positive comments as well.

New business:

•Tom, KD8JRK noted that his father Bob, K8RLS was out of the hospital and would appreciate visitors.

•Don, K8OMO announced to the club that a local area disaster drill centered at the Hoover-Price campus was scheduled for October 18 and that operators were needed.

Joe, KC8TAC added that area people participating in the drill would be coming to Alliance Community Hospital and that another coordinating hospital or pseudo-hospital may also need a communications person.

•VP John asked to borrow the club's Yaesu transceiver for the Pennsylvania QSO party on the upcoming weekend and made a motion thereof. The motion was seconded by Tom, KD8JRK and passed on a voice vote.

•John also noted the club's web site renewal was due at the end of the month and made a motion to renew. This was seconded by Sam, KC8ETZ and passed on a voice vote.

•VP John noted that the Zero Beat newsletter had received second place in the Ohio Section newsletter competition.

•John reported that an amateur radio club in Newark had received permission to place a shortwave radio in

their public library for patrons to use, including information about their club and ham radio in general. He wondered if AARC should look into doing the same.

President Frank then suggested the club think about it until the next meeting.

•John then noted that the next meeting, in November, was homebrew night, with members encouraged to bring in any homebrew projects they might have built to share with everyone. A small prize would be awarded for the best project.

•Joe, KC8TAC moved to allocate \$100 for door prizes at the club Christmas dinner along with funds to pay for the dinner of a guest of honor. This was seconded by Jerry, KG8RN and passed on a voice vote.

•Jerry commented on the Knox Safety Day, held on October 3, then asked the club if anyone had any opinions about the Cuyahoga County tailgate hamfest. However, apparently no other club member was aware of it or had attended.

•Jerry then suggested the club might again consider sponsoring a hamfest with possible sites including the Mile Branch Grange or the Columbiana County fairgrounds. After some discussion, President Frank suggested tabling the matter until discussions might be held with the Salem club and pos-

sibly others about jointly sponsoring such an event.

As there were no other apparent nominations, Joe, KC8TAC moved that nominations be closed, with Tom, KD8JRK seconding (approved).

The election for President was then carried out by paper ballots, with John winning the election.

•Howard, K8DXR, nominated in absentia by Tom, KD8JRK and seconded by George, K3GP.

With no other apparent nominations, Tom moved that nominations be closed, with Joe, KC8TAC seconding (approved). Howard's election was then approved by voice vote.

Nominations for Treasurer:

•Mary Ann, KB8IVS nominated by George, K3GP and seconded by Frank, WA8WHP. With no other nominations, Tom then moved that nominations be closed, with Joe seconding (approved). Mary Ann was then re-elected by voice vote.

Nominations for Secretary:

•Don, AB8KV nominated by John, KD8MQ and seconded by Tom, KD8JRK. With no other nominations, Tom moved that nominations be closed, with Larry, AA8NV seconding (approved). Don was then re-elected by voice vote.

Nominations for Trustee

(replacing George, whose term was expiring):

•Tom, KD8JRK nominated by Joe, KC8TAC. Don, K8OMO opposed the nomination on the grounds that Tom, being a relatively new ham and club member, was not yet experienced enough for the Trustee position. Joe subsequently withdrew his nomination.

•Frank, WA8WHP by John, KD8MQ with several others seconding the motion. Joe then moved that nominations be closed, with Tom seconding (approved). Frank

was then elected by voice vote.

With elections completed, Frank requested a motion to adjourn the meeting. George so moved, with Tom seconding. The meeting was thus adjourned at approximately 8:40 PM.

C6APR Team Dies in Plane crash!

Just after take-off -- around 6:30 AM on Wednesday, October 21 -- a twin-engine plane carrying four Amateur Radio operators crashed into the woods, only 250 yards off the end of the runway in Jedburg, South Carolina, about 20 miles northwest of Charleston. The plane -- piloted and owned by Peter Radding, W2GJ -- carried Ed Steeble, K3IXD, Dallas Carter, W3PP, and Randy Hargenrader, K4QO. The four men were on their way to the Bahamas to operate in this weekend's CQ World Wide Phone Contest as C6APR, competing in the Multi/2 category.

Radding, of North Charleston, South Carolina,

was 69; Steeble, of Summerville, South Carolina was 68; Carter, of Laurel, Delaware, was 67 and Hargenrader, also of Summerville, was 55. All were ARRL members; Radding and Steeble were Life Members.

According to Dorchester County Coroner Chris Nisbet, the four hams had made this trip before with Radding piloting the plane. Nisbet said Radding had flown to Delaware to pick up Carter earlier in the week.

"How quickly can a joyous event -- setting off with close friends in anticipation of a weekend of intense radio activity -- turn to unfathomable tragedy," said ARRL Chief Executive Officer

David Sumner, K1ZZ. "As we mourn the loss of these four well-known members of our global Amateur Radio community, our hearts go out to their families."

Dorchester County Administrator Jason Ward characterized the crash site 250 yards east of the runway as "extremely severe" and that the plane was fully engulfed in flames when firefighters arrived; investigators were hindered by the flaming wreckage and "charred foliage" at the scene. A crew from the county public works department had to create a path to the wreckage. Chief Deputy Sheriff Sam Richardson said there was damage

to treetops in the area of the crash. The coroner said it appears the severity of the crash, and not the fire, is what killed the men.

One of the victims was found beneath some of the wreckage, Ward said. Debris was spread around an area several yards wide at the crash site, and the wrecked plane was apparently upside down, he said.

It was extremely dark when the plane took off, Ward said. Airport Manager Don Hay said the weather was clear at the time. "[Radding] was a very experienced pilot who knew the area," Ward said. "He had been flying for over 40

years." Nisbet said Radding filed a flight plan detailing his route and who was on board, but the plane never climbed high enough for those plans to be activated.

Robert Biss, W8ZA, of Harpers Ferry, West Virginia, accompanied Steeble, Carter, Radding and Hargenrader to the Bahamas last year for the 2008 running of the CQWW SSB Contest. "It was only one year to the day that I first flew with Pete Radding, W2GJ," he told the ARRL. "He was a good pilot with more than 40 years experience. He loved to fly and did a lot of it. Pete was also president of the [Angel Flight](#) organization for the Southeastern United States. I met

Ed Steeble through common interests -- ham radio and contesting -- and the Potomac Valley Radio Club. In time, Ed became the Liaison Officer between my place of employment and his, and we spent more time together. He also joined our club station at work and became one of the operators at W8ZA Multi-Multi station for SSB DX contests. Even after he moved to South Carolina, he made the 10 hour trip several times to contest with friends. I had talked with Dallas many times over the years, but had never met him personally until just before we left for the Bahamas. I met Randy for the first time

in October 2008 when we had our departure dinner in Summerville. It is just too hard to understand what went wrong this time. I will wait until the NTSB releases it report. Until then I will grieve along with their families and the ham radio fraternity, for we have lost four very special people in this one tragic event."

Radding's neighbor, Jim Deaton, said the man and others planned to stop in Florida, pick up more passengers and then head to the Bahamas.

Stella Bazzle, who lives about a half-mile from the airport, described to [The Summerville Journal Scene](#) what she heard right before the plane went down: "The motor sounded like it was coming over the house. I heard the first explosion...then the second (explosion) wasn't as loud." She described the engine noise as "kind of a funny noise, like a grinding type thing." Bazzle said she then heard ambulances and called her neighbor, who'd heard similar noises.

Carter, Steeble and Radding were members of the Potomac Valley Radio Club ([PVRC](#)); Carter and Radding were also members of the Frankford Radio Club ([FRC](#)). PVRC President Ken Claerbout, K4ZW, told the ARRL that he was "stunned and saddened" when he heard the news of the crash:

"I had several e-mail exchanges with Dallas over the last two weeks about our Sweepstakes effort. He spoke with excitement of the group's trip to C6 for CQWW SSB and vowed to be on for Sweepstakes CW. He said he might have to work during Sweepstakes SSB, but if not, he would be there! Dallas joined PVRC in 1963. Ed was also a very active member of PVRC before moving to South Carolina. Ed joined PVRC in 1992 and is a past chairman of our Northwest Chapter. Our thoughts and prayers go out to the friends and families of all four gentlemen. Another stark reminder of how fickle life can be." -- *Thanks to the many friends of these four hams, the Associated Press and The Summerville Journal Scene for the information*
