We Build the "The Ugly Transceiver" from ARRL Handbook

Chapter 30 of the '94 (I think) handbook has a 1 watt 40 meter transceiver created by Roger Haryward KA7XEM son of legend W7ZOL. Construction was started last year one Sunday afternoon. I laid out my own quick and dirty PCBs and etched them. Parts were added and the subassemblies wired together. Then I put it in a cardboard box and let it age for a year or so. Good electronics requires ageing! OK so maybe I get enough pain designing super regens that are put in production at half million + units a year (requires a sadistic nature).

Anyway, so next step is to debug this radio gadget. This kid author has three stages cascaded together with no D.C. blocks. Now the HFE of 2N3906 like devices varies from 50 or so to 250 or so. Page 30-38 says "Transistor selection is not critical ...". The looks of circuit on page 17.18 of '95 handbook looks like a better radio (have not built). Me -- well I build a lot of what shows up -- just to see what I can learn. I ended up changing the bias on the circuit a little rather than selecting devices that make the unit work.

So now the circuits are working on the bench. I used the turn counter from a *OLD* microwave tube amplifier unit that had been ransacked internally before I bought it (from Goodyear hamfest). The counter was cut out using a metal cutting band saw to use in new units vfo. The case is a *ugly* home made pine box. I built it about 6 times the volume of the handbook unit for ease of building and/or future modification.

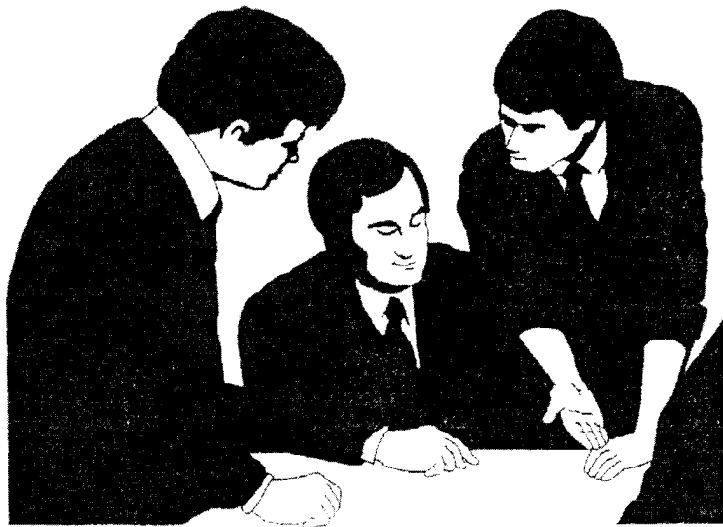
From The Presidents Desk

So the radio functions are basically working -- it is time to assemble the PCBs to the VFO capacitor, adjust the band spread test the keying, mute, sidetone, switching, and other functions.

The sidetone bias had to be tweaked in my unit to get it oscillating. The side tone is an old standard design, that usually chirps, and it does in this unit as well. The mute works -- with no changes.

The keying on the transmitter looks good on the 'scope but I had to chop out a series RC circuit -- Had chirp when key was released on my unit. Keying now sounds OK -- think they have value wrong on schematic on series RC.

Worked rare DX station K8LTG (thanks again Jim) and rare DX country North Canton first night on air with 1 watt of raw rf power (12/2/96) -- Next weekend maybe I can get into 4 land! -- AA8GY

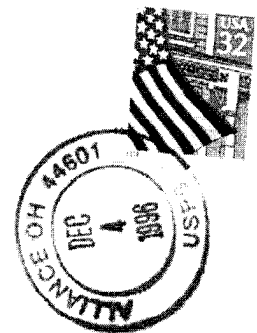
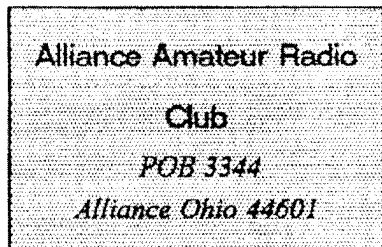
