The Quarter Century Wireless Association invites you to become a member of our association and our local chapter. If you held an amateur radio license 25 or more years ago and are currently licensed¹, you will be welcomed.

Our local chapter is Canton, OH Chapter 21 which is centered around Stark County, although we have members from Columbus, Cadiz, and Erie. We meet in February, May, August, and November, usually on the third Saturday for either lunch or dinner at various restaurants. There is a short program of general interest. Guests, YL, XYL, YF, etc., are included and welcomed. Our chapter dues are \$5 per year. Chapter 21 has a net on 146.79- each Thursday evening at 1930L and is open to everyone.

Membership in our national QCWA is required. National headquarters are in Eugene, OR. The basic national dues are \$20 per year. A Journal is published quarterly, and a convention is held each year in a different city. QCWA sponsors awards, contests, scholarships, and nets.
