Dennis Moriarty, K8AGB to Speak on Radio and Television Interference at May Meeting

Dennis spent 30 years investigating Radio and Television interference problems caused primarily by the electric distribution lines. He has been licensed as K8AGB since 1956 and also holds an FCC commercial operator's license. He is also a member of QCWA, Radio Club of America, DARF/U-CAN, and Hiram Hams.

After the March presentation, at least one club member was able to solve an interference problem that had been plaguing him for some time. Don, K8OMO, found a problem with the power line near his home that was generating noise.

Probably all of us have had household appliances that caused noise problems. I once had an aquarium heater that turned itself on and off about 30 times a second and generated a terrible noise.

Dennis is sure to have some good tips that will help you track down interference that you have or will have in the future. So plan on attending the meeting on May 7th and help us welcome Dennis back. \Box

ALLIANCE AMATEUR RADIO CLUB

April 2, 2003

The regular meeting of the Alliance Amateur Radio Club was held at the Alliance Community Hospital on April 2, 2003, at 7:30 P. M., with Robert Steele K8RLS, president, presiding. Secretary David Glass W8UKQ kept the minutes. There were 20 members and 4 guests present.

The Pledge of Allegiance was given, and introductions were given.

The minutes of the last meeting were published in the newsletter. The report was approved on motion by Jim K8LTG, seconded by Larry KE8VE.

Mary Ann KB8IVS reported the treasury balances. The report was approved upon motion by Gladys KB8GIA, seconded by Sam KC8ETZ.

Old Business: Don K8OMO did not have a report about the van

Don K8OMO reported that there were 15 check ins for the Skywarn Net, and 19 members attended the Skywarn program at Stark State. He advised members to keep a roster of check ins during an emergency net so that everyone will know whom to call or to replace if the NCS or assignments need to be changed.

ARES badges were available at the Skywarn program.

The liability insurance premium will be paid soon.

Everyone enjoyed the program last month about interference. Don K8OMO said he was able to locate a trouble spot afterwards. Dave W8UKQ will schedule the second interference program by Dennis Moriarty K8AGB.

The Special Event for Carnation Days in the Park was discussed. The committee of Don K8OMO, Joe KC8TAC, Don AB8KV, and Bob K8RLS will set up the frequencies and times for the QST notice. A request will be made to use the bicentennial logo for the certificate.

New Business: Doug Bowling AB8CJ, a Marlington High School teacher, made a presentation regarding "The Big Project" for which he has received equipment from the ARRL to set up an amateur station at the school. Phase I is to work with

a local club to set up demonstrations, for technical support, for VE testing, for test equipment, and for links to bookshelves. He can buy a set of ARRL books for \$200. Phase II will be to secure more equipment. He hopes to have an HF station in operation before school is out, and the rest of the equipment in operation before September. After considerable discussion. Jack W8WEN moved that the club donate \$100 to Marlington High School for ARRL books so that Mr. Bowling may seek additional funds from the school, and that the club make up any necessary difference. The motion was seconded by Jim N8XTJ and approved upon vote.

Jerry N8SH moved that Mr. Bowling be given a two years free membership in the club and a one year free membership to any high school student who gets an amateur license. The motion was seconded by Joe KC8TAC and approved upon vote.

It was noted that Paul Harvey paid a tribute on his program to ham operators.

Don K8OMO urged members to be extra vigilant during this time of Homeland Security. Watch for unusual things
