November, 1987, (editor N8IAK)

- Our Ham of the Month was Gene Smythe, KB8BYK
- The upcoming fox hunt was scheduled for Halloween day. A Halloween party was to follow at Don Panchos.
- An anonymous person had stepped up to offer free printing for the Zero Beat.

(There was no November, 1997 issue of the ZB)

November, 1992, (editor N8LVO)

• The 1992 elections had been held in October. The 1992/3 officers were:

Pres. - Pam Myers, N8IAK Vice Pres. - Larry Ashburn, KE8VE Treasurer - Allen Dicks, WI8T Secretary - Dan Mutigli, N8LVO

- John, WX8G related a TV repair where water had entered the rotator cable, and had wicked all the way to the control box, and leaked into the TV.
- In 1992, as today, we were requesting votes for Ham of the Year. Jack, W8WEN was the outgoing HOTY.
- Our Christmas party was coming up on Dec. 12, at Roadhouse Charlies. Dinners ranged in price from \$8.25—\$12.95.

- We ran an interesting reprint from the Ham History newsgroup. KE9V had just finished his collection of "Radio Boys" book series, and gave us some history on them.
- KE8VE's editorial advocated the return of the HF spectrum back to our control.
- There was a description of the KD8MQ/3 operation in Armstrong Cty, PA.
