June Minutes

June 2, 2010

The regular meeting of the Alliance Amateur Radio Club was held on June 2, 2010 at 7:30 PM at Alliance Community Hospital, with President John Myers (KD8MQ) presiding. The pledge of allegiance was recited followed by introductions. There were 16 members present along with the following quests: Hugh Simpson (WA8ETW), Sue Simpson (N8AJU), Ken Simpson Rich (W8EK), McDaniel (WB8TPG), and our guest speaker Geoff Howard (W0CG-PJ2DX).

President John announced the club birthdays for June:

For the Secretary's report Don, (AB8KV) noted that the May minutes were in the newsletter. He then reported that it was not possible to get an announcement of the club's special event station planned for the Mile Branch Grange Fair into QST since the deadline for July postings was May 1 and club plans were not yet finalized at that time. With nothing further, the Secretary's report was approved on a motion by Tom (KD8JRK) and seconded by Vice President Howard (K8DXR).

Treasurer Mary Ann (KB8IVS) gave the Treasurer's report. The report was approved on a motion by VP Howard and seconded by Tom.

Committee reports:

•President John announced that next month's program included Dale Lamm (NX8J) bringing a replica of an old time radio transmitter.

•Concerning Field Day, John reported that Ben was going to operate natural power and that Saturday evenings' meal would be a carry-in dinner.

He then raised a guestion about possibly setting up on Friday night instead of Saturday. (K8OMO) Don noted that his boom truck would not be available this year, and after further discussion it was decided to set up on Saturday as in previous years. For antennas, John said he could set up for 40/80/160 while Don stated he and Tony could provide a vertical. 20-meter Tomas (KC8ZEH) offered two monoband verticals. For the GOTA station, the exact equipment and antenna was left up to Tom who would be running it. The class would be 2A or 3A depending upon what transmitters and antennas were actually available at the time. Joe (KC8TAC) was thought to be bringing one or two generators.

•For ARES, Don reported that the disaster drill con-

ducted on May 10 went well.

•Concerning ARRL, Tom noted that Ohio legislature bills (SB218 and HB212) to provide state enforcement of the Federal PRB-1 rules were in process and needed support. He also reported that the ARRL had available scholarships for qualified students.

Old business:

Concerning the Stark county QSO party, President John reminded the club that the prize winners were noted in the newsletter and that next year's event would be on April 9. He noted that there would be а few changes to the rules for next year. He then announced that first place for club participation went to PCARS with AARC in second place. He also handed out certificates appreciation to (K8OMO) and Tomas for their participation.

•For the special event station at the Mile Branch Grange Fair (July 22-24) Jerry (KG8RN) reported that the club had received a donated half-space (8' by 15') with an assigned number of 10A. He noted that the registration form needed sent in along with a copy of the club's insurance coverage. Secretary Don was assigned to accomplish that. Some discussion followed concerning antenna and coax placement, with details to be ironed out at the July meet-

Have You Backed up Lately?

No, this is not a story about driving, however, in some ways, it is also an important subject.

A few years ago, I acquired the habit of carrying all of my data on a flash drive. You may know it as a dongle, a memory stick, a memory chip, or any of a number of different synonyms. It's something I do to this day. Since I have access to several different computers, it works for me to carry my data that way. A few weeks ago I made an error that garbled the data on my flash drive.

Luckily, I had done a backup ten days earlier. So, between that backup, and a piece of freeware I found on download.com, I was able to recover 99% of the data on the drive.

I'm hoping that you stayed with me this long, because there is a point to this. Stop for a minute, and think about the data stored on your computer drives. I'm talking about your hard drive, as well as flash drives. If the drive crashed right now, what would you do?

We keep a lot of info on our computers. This includes:

- Pictures
- Music
- Banking information
- Passwords
- •E-mails

What would you do if it

all became unreadable? If you've implemented a backup routine, then chances are that a crash will not be a life-changing event. But, if you have no backup plan, then in the words, of Sheriff Buford T. Justice, "You got trouble comin".

There's a lot of options when considering some sort of backup plan. Following is the routine which works for me.

All of the data which I use regularly is stored on my flash drive. In addition, I back up my banking information from Quicken to that location.

I use a program called EZBack-it-up for the rest of backups. It can be downloaded as freeware. Just Google "EZBack-it-up". Using it, I create backup routines for both my Hard drive, and flash drive. These get backed up to my backup drive. I back up to a 1Tb external USB HD. You could also back up to an additional hard drive installed in your computer. One word of caution, though. Do not back up to the hard drive which you are backing up. This includes unused partitions to your Hard Drive.

So far, I'd been running backups monthly, but am now backing up weekly.

How you back up is up to you, but it is important that you do back up.
