

Alliance ARC DX Contest begins October 1st

How many countries can you work in six months? well, it's time once again for you to find out. The 2nd annual AARC DXCC contest begins in less than a month. After an initial rough start, we're going to try it again. Here are the rules for the 2016 contest:

The object: to see who can work the most DXCC countries between 0000z October 1, 2015, and 2359z on March 31, 2016.

Bands: All bands DC to Daylight are eligible.

Paperwork: We are putting you on the honor system. No LOTW, or EQSL required. No stressing out over getting QSL cards. Just export your log for that period to an ADI file, and send it in.

The prize: The prize will be announced in the October 2015 issue of the Zero Beat.

Logs will be judged according to ARRL DXCC Countries list, and scored electronically using N3FJP AC Log.

The recipient of the AARC DX award #1 was Rex, NX8G. Who will be the winner for AARC DX award #2?
