AARC Welcomes New 2 Meter Repeater

Well, after what seems like forever, We took delivery recently of a brand new Yaesu DR-1XFR repeater. This machine, once set up, will be capable of both analog, and digital modes. Accessing the digital side requires a Yaesu System Fusion or comparable radio.

The changes (you knew there would be changes, right?) will be minor. Here's what you can expect once the new repeater comes on line.

- The range will be somewhat reduced until we can get the repeater antenna mounted on the tower. Right now, my yard is a sopping wet mess. I estimate that it'll take about a week of dry weather before we can think of getting any tower work done.
- 2) We'll still be running the Tone Squelch on the transmit side, but there will also be a tone required to access the repeater. Both tones will be 110.9. If you have issues with programming your rigs, Frank, WA8WHP has volunteered his services to help out. He will also be available to program rigs at upcoming club meetings.
- 3) Expect some periodic downtimes while we do adjustments, and hardware swaps.

The machine will be brought online in stages. First, running with a dual band J-Pole for an antenna. It will also be using a borrowed pair of duplexers. Power output will be 20 watts.

The antenna will be replaced once my yard dries out. The Duplexers will be swapped for our own once our duplexers have been checked out and re-tuned (if necessary) on a service monitor. We'll be increasing power once a suitable amp is found. (I had planned to use my amp, but it was found to be unsuitable for this application.)

All we ask is that you bear with us as we get the system dialed in.

Once the new repeater comes online, we will be notifying you via email/website, as well as via the club Facebook group.

Thanks again for everyone's patience.
