It's that time again. The AARC DX Challenge begins at 0000Z on Wednesday, September 30th, and continues until 2359Z March 31st. It's similar to CQ Magazines DX Marathon. The challenge part of it is to see just how many different DX countries you can work in 6 months.

The 2019/20 version was won by James, KD8VT.

The rules are simple;

- 1) You must be a AARC member during the 6 month period.
- 2) All DX entities count once, Regardless of Band, or Mode.
- 3) All bands & Modes are eligible
- 4) You are on the honor system. Just send in your logs at the end, and we'll score them.
