October 19, 2024 - 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.



BRRRRR it is cold outside....no wait, this is Ohio and who knows what the weather will be at any one time of day? But that is the job of the meteorologist and the weather stations all over the world.

Weather Merit Badge explores Meteorology, the study of earth's atmosphere, its weather and the ways in which temperature, wind, and moisture act together in the environment. Learn about many of the weather issues such as the water cycle, type of

clouds, climate, weather watches and/or warnings and what is "Sky Warn".

There will also be an opportunity to learn directly from Trent McGill, head meteorologist at WEWS in Cleveland, about the job of keeping us all informed about the "weather". Most of the requirements will be completed in the morning and a "weather related" lunch will be offered in Kimble Hall.

This weekend coincides with the Jamboree-on-the-Air, or JOTA, the largest Scouting event in the world. Typically, more than 1 million Scouts participate with over 11,000 stations operated by 20,000+ amateur radio operators from 150+ countries. The scouts will be sent to various amateur radio clubs' stations and find out how to contact Jamboree on the Air, and Parks on the Air and maybe even more contacts from all over the world. Participation in JOTA earns credit for requirement 7E of Citizenship in the World Merit Badge.

There will be opportunities to do some "hands on" activities and scouts will also be able to enter a drawing for a Weather radio. A fun day for all and you will leave camp being better prepared for whatever the weather will bring!

The registration fee is \$30 per participant, which includes the day's activities, a JOTA patch and weather-themed lunch. To register, please fill out the registration form below to sign up your troop, to make sure we have enough supplies for everyone. Payment for the day can be made at registration or mailed in ahead of time.


